

Psoriderm™ Scalp Lotion Shampoo Distilled Coal Tar 2.5%.

Uses: For the topical treatment of scalp psoriasis.

Directions: For adults, children & the elderly. Use as a shampoo, daily if necessary, reducing the frequency of use to once or twice a week as the condition improves. Thereafter, occasional use may be necessary. Wet the hair thoroughly and apply a small amount of shampoo to the scalp. Massage gently to form a rich lather, leave for a few minutes and remove excess lather with the hands before rinsing with warm water. Repeat if necessary.

Psoriderm™ Cream Distilled Coal Tar 6%.

Uses: For the topical treatment of sub-acute and chronic psoriasis, including psoriasis of the scalp and flexures.

Directions: For adults, children & the elderly. Apply to affected area once or twice daily. Wash hands after use.

Instruct patients not to smoke or go near naked flames. Fabric (clothing, bedding, dressings etc) that has been in contact with this product burns more easily and is a potential fire hazard. Washing clothing and bedding may reduce product build-up but not totally remove it.

Contra-indications, warnings, side effects etc: Please refer to SPC for full details before prescribing. Not to be used for acute, sore or pustular psoriasis or in the presence of infection. Do not use if sensitive to any of the ingredients. Keep away from the eyes and mucous membranes. In rare cases of skin irritation, acne-like eruptions or photosensitivity, discontinue treatment. If there is no improvement after 4 weeks, or the scalp condition seems to look or feel worse, discontinue treatment. Rarely, may stain skin, hair or fabric. Avoid using Psoriderm Cream on rectal or genital areas or broken skin. Avoid spillage.
